Substantive Editing



The first draft is done...now the real work begins. Line or substantive editing gets into the weeds to make sure the content is clear and compelling, strong verbs are used, the chapters flow from one to the next, and overall makes sense from beginning to end.

Copyediting



The devil is in the details...grammar, typos, inconsistencies, misplaced commas, all the fun stuff gets fixed in this round. After copyediting, the once raw manuscript is starting to look polished!

Proofreading

One last final go through because you can never have too many eyes on a project. Any typos missed and formatting are checked at this level of editing.
